



Higher Education System in Georgia

- Three cycle degree system (bachelor, master and PhD) – fully implemented in all fields of study except medicine & teacher education
- Most common model 240 + 120 credits (4 + 2 years) (180+60 expected)
- Unified admission exams (on the basis of completed middle school level; age 18+)
- NQF system adopted
- Internal and external QA system
- Several cycles of institutional and programme accreditation

Higher Education System in Georgia



- Bologna process joined in 2005, (formally) implemented all principles;
- University autonomy fixed in the Constitution and in the Law on HE: freedom of the HEI and its main units to independently decide and implement its academic, financial and economic, and administrative activities;
- Funding per capita funding; new model in discussion;
- Language of tuition mostly Georgian (study programmes in English and other languages available);

Higher Education System in Georgia



Main problems & challenges:

- Lack of funding
- Aging academic staff
- Increased international competition & brain drain (?)
- Documents vs reality

- Internationalization of teaching and QA process
- Improvement of university management
- Funding of HE system

EU Programmes in Georgia



- In Tempus since 1995 (ENPI East), Erasmus Mundus since 2007, in Erasmus+ since 2014
- Extended network of "Erasmus+ experienced" public and private HEIs (70% of HEIs involved)
- Experience of regional and cross-regional cooperation
- Experience in CBHE project coordination
- Partnerships with all 33 programme countries
- 77 Tempus + 24 CBHE projects implemented (leading in the Caucasia, second in the EPC after Ukraine)
- 14 Jean Monnet projects
- Top places in Erasmus+ credit mobility for four consecutive years (#6 among 141 partner countries)
- Georgia in top 20 EMJMD countries (joint master degree programme scholarships)
- 6 Georgian HEIs are full and/or associate partners in EMJMDs
