

## Erasmus+ European Universities – Call 2020

Following last year's launch of the European Universities initiative, the first call for proposals has resulted in applications from 54 alliances, involving more than 300 higher education institutions from 31 European countries, including all EU Member States.

Eventually, 17 alliances have been selected, including 114 higher education institutions from 25 Programme Countries. Austria is excellently represented by the University of Graz within the 'ARQUS' alliance and the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences within the alliance 'EPICUR'.

Today shall take account of the lessons learned from the first call and prepare potential applicants for the second call on the European Universities initiative.
